Classification of disasters Disasters can be divided into 2 large categories (Box 2): - Those caused by natural forces - Those caused by man Natural disasters Natural disasters are caused by natural forces, such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, hurricanes, fires, tornados, and extreme temperatures

Prevention - The outright avoidance of adverse impacts of hazards and related disasters Public awareness - The extent of common knowledge about disaster risks, the factors that lead to disasters and the actions that can be taken, individually and collectively, to reduce exposure and vulnerability to hazards
